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
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DIRECTOR'S NOTE:

The King and I is the fifth musical by Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II. It is based on the 1944 novel Anna and the King of Siam by Margaret Landon, which is in turn derived from the memoirs of Anna Leonowens, governess to the children of King Mongkut of Siam in the early 1860s.



In 1950, veteran leading lady Gertrude Lawrence approached Rodgers and Hammerstein about writing a musical for her, based on Margaret Landon's book. At first they were reluctant. Unlike their previous musicals, this was a story in which no love interest involved the two leading characters, and which ends with the death of the hero.

Rex Harrison was their first choice to play the King, a role that he had played in the 1946 film made from Landon's book, but he was unavailable. They settled on the young actor Yul Brynner, which turned out to be a perfect choice. The musical premiered on March 29, 1951, at Broadway's St. James Theatre. It ran nearly three years, then the fourth longest-running Broadway musical in history.

The musical was an immediate hit, winning Tony Awards for Best Musical, Best Actress (for Lawrence) and Best Featured Actor (for Brynner). A hit London run and U.S. national tour followed, together with a 1956 film for which Brynner won an Academy Award. Brynner came to dominate his role, starring in a four-year national tour culminating in a 1985 Broadway run shortly before his death. Additional revivals on Broadway (1996, 2015) also won Tony Awards.

It is clear that Rodgers and Hammerstein met their challenge without equivocations. They created a picture of the East with dignity, and without resorting to any of the clichés previously portraying the Orient in musical theater. Controversial from the start, this story nevertheless continues to thrive: contrasting old and new, East and West, patriarchy with women's rights, freedom and slavery, fact mixed with exaggeration or even fiction.

And now, we proudly bring the story to you.
