

DIRECTOR'S NOTE:

When it was suggested that our musical selection committee read My Favorite Year, the Musical we were a little hesitant. After all, it was virtually unknown to us. We were familiar with the 1982 movie of the same name starring Peter O'Toole as Alan Swann and Connecticut resident Mark Linn-Baker as Benjy Stone, but not of the musical version. However, after reading it we knew immediately that My Favorite Year was the perfect fit for TGS with its wonderful story, large ensemble numbers, full orchestrations, interesting roles for varied ages, and tuneful music.

My Favorite Year opened on December 10, 1992 at Lincoln Center and played for 65 performances before closing on January 10, 1993, long enough to be nominated for 3 Tony awards including Best Actor for Tim Curry (Alan Swann) and Best Supporting Actress for Lainie Kazan (Belle) and Andrea Martin (Alice) who won the category. They even recorded a cast album.

Perhaps its short run was the result of something as simple as poor timing, competing with *Les Miz, Phantom of the Opera, Miss Saigon*, and *Cats*, or perhaps the show lacked the "sophistication" of the time, losing to the year's best musical *Kiss of the Spider Woman*.

But despite all of this, we have loved every minute of working on this show. The catchy tunes stuck in our heads, the humor kept us laughing during rehearsals, and the lyrics, such as in the song "If Life Were Like the Movies" brought tears to our eves.

We are so glad we chose to present My Favorite Year, the Musical and hope that you enjoy it as much as we do!






WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST
